CHÂTEAU DOMI-COURS 2020 "VITAE" SAUVIGNON BLANC, BOURDEAUX, FRANCE

This wine is made from 100% Sauvignon Blanc, a rarity for the Bordeaux region where almost all wines are blends. Chateau Domi-Cours is located in the heart of the Entre-Deux-Mers region, not far from Saint-Emilion. Made from vines grown on a mix of clay and silt soil, this wine is bright and vibrant with lively acidity and crisp notes of tropical fruit.

CHÂTEAU PLAISANCE 2018, MONTAGNE SAINT-EMILION, FRANCE

This Merlot based blend comes from a Chateau located to the west of Montagne, on the border between the Saint-Emilion and Lalande-de-Pomerol appellations. The terroir, with loamy-clay soils, and the gentle slopes allow for excellent natural drainage. Slightly rustic in character, this wine has notes of old leather and freshly tilled earth, alongside dark, juicy plum.


MARQUIS DE MONS 2017, MARGAUX, FRANCE

Marquis de Mons is the second wine of the Château La Tour de Mons, Cru Bourgeois Margaux. The Château La Tour de Mons is a single block vineyard, located in the northern part of the Margaux appellation on the banks of the Garonne, alongside some of the best Médoc Crus. The origin of the château dates back to the 13th century. Amongst its illustrious owners was Pierre de Mons, who acquired the property in 1623 and gave it his name. Garonne gravels and clay-limestone are the prevalent soils here.

The vines for this bottling are 31 years old and the blend is composed of 80% Merlot and 20% Cabernet Sauvignon.

CHÂTEAU PLAISANCE 2018, MONTAGNE SAINT-EMILION, FRANCE

CHÂTEAU BIAC 2014, CADILLAC, FRANCE

Château Biac's unique setting overlooking the Garonne River and the plain of the Graves, has not only been a timeless witness to the region's history, but also to the geological movements of the area, now embedded in its unique "terroir".

Archived by the Feret Editions as a wine producing estate since their second publication in the mid 19th century, its history goes back much further in time to the Roman era, when the Romans brought vines with them to the Aquitaine and planted the first vineyards in the area around Biac.

85% Merlot, 10% Petit Verdot, 5% Cabernet Franc aged 16 months in barrels.

Soil overview:

Merlot - Silt and clay with a chalk sub soil and medium density gravel

Cabernet - Sauvignon High density gravel with sub soil of silt and clay

Cabernet - Franc Clay and chalk with on a clay with a chalk sub soil

Petit Verdot - Clay with silt and sand

Vintage Weather - A mild and humid winter followed by a mild spring. Summer was wet and stormy but was followed by the longest Indian summer on record for over 100 years!
