## **POE 2019 PINOT MEUNIÈRE, VAN DER KAMP VINEYARD, SONOMA MOUNTAIN**

With bright, ripe notes of pomegranate and cranberry with a hint of baking spice, this is a perfect example especially when served at cellar temperature.
