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LAGAR DE CERVERA 2020, ALBARINO, RIAS BAIXAS, SPAIN

When it comes to Albariño, it's pretty tough to beat the region of Rias Baixas in the high North West of Spain. This bottling comes from a producer with a particularly legendary pedigree, La Rioja Alta. While best known for their Tempranillo based reds, this Albariño is a stunner at a very reasonable price point as well.

Aged on the lees with occasional stirring to extract additional body to match the naturally high acid of the varietal, this wine displays notes of Meyer Lemon, Stone Fruits, and a gentle salinity.

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MONASTERIO DE LAS VINAS 2015, RED BLEND, CARIÑENA, ARAGÓN, SPAIN

This blend of Cariñena, Grenache, and Tempranillo was sourced from various plots, ranging from 35 to 45 years old. The Tempranillo and Cariñena are aged for 12 months in French oak barrels while the Garnacha spends 12 months in American oak barrels. After careful selection and blending, this Reserva is stored in a bottle for an additional 24 months before release.

Cariñena is both the name of the region in Spain, located in North East of the country South of Rioja, as well as the name of its flagship varietal, better known in the States as Carignan.

CA'N VERDURA 2020, "NEGRE," BINISSALEM, MALLORCA, SPAIN

Island wines are often something unique and special showing of a condensed expression of their geographical formation and proximity to the sea. This wine is no exception. Made up of 60% Mantonegro, 18% Merlot, 11% Cabernet, 6% Monastrell, and 5% Callet, this blend is fermented with indigenous yeast and then aged in a combination of stainless steel and older French oak.




GARMÓN 2016, TEMPRANILLO, RIBERA DEL DUERO, SPAIN

Garmón is the García family's ode to the varietal Tempranillo and their commitment to ancestral viticulture based on old low yield vineyards situated in the high, cool, and Northern continental riverside area of Ribera del Duero.

The 2016 vintage was only the second for this winemaking family's newest label and if it is any indication of their future releases, we are excited to see what comes next. This 100% Tempranillo from vineyards ranging from 30 to 100 years old, is aged for 16 months in French oak and is fermented using native yeast.
